Something to Think About...

Life of late seems to be a jumble of BIG things and little things. Lots of big things are happening everywhere you turn and yet there are the little frustrations that must continue to be given attention on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, or even annual basis. Scripture is not silent on this ebb and flow of the hide tides and low tides of life.

We are told that "if [we] have the faith of a grain of a mustard seed, [we] can say to the mountain,"go be thrown into the sea" and it will be done for [us]". In part, this shows the immense potency of faith. However, how often does that faith go unrealized for big things in the life of the believer? How often do we succumb to fears and insecurities about our unworthiness and inability to do what Jesus has called and commanded us to (as if it was us doing it in the first place)? We settle for a life of mediocrity instead of the abundant life that Christ came to give.

Sometimes, we are hampered and hamstrung by our pride that keeps wickedly whispering in our ear, "You deserve better" and "Why does so and so see God working and moving in their life in such a powerful way? Why has He forsaken you?". These are lies that keep us laying on our mat by the temple pool instead of just trusting in Christ and following. He tells us that if we are faithful in the little things, we will be given more. So why do we sit sulking over big things while the little things remain incomplete and undone?

We can also see this tension of the big and little stuff played out in a kind of legalism. Feeling like unless we get everything perfect, we won't see the movement of God in our lives. If in leadership, we can tend to build up these "death by a thousand cuts" piles of straw to break the camel's back to place on the shoulders of the flock entrusted to us. Jesus had harsh words for the Pharisees in this regard and said, "You strain out a gnat, only to swallow a camel". In the southern vernacular, we make "mountains out of molehills" only to be surprised when our faith is then unable to move the mountain we have created.

So wherever we find ourselves on this spectrum, let's be faithful in the little things until He calls us to greater things and then continue to walk in His Spirit's power to move real mountains!
